# Call for Abstracts for 2<sup>nd</sup> National Conference

Action Research for Community Adaptation in Bangladesh (ARCAB) invites you to submit an abstract for presentation at the 2<sup>nd</sup> national Community Based Adaptation (CBA) conference on March 14-15<sup>th</sup>, 2014 at the Spectra Convention Centre in Dhaka.

As CBA receives increasing attention for balancing community engagement with responses to climate change, Bangladesh has emerged as a leader in both CBA research and practice.   - Poster sessions will provide an opportunity for participants to discuss in greater detail with the presenter in a more informal setting

- Your abstract (200 words or fewer)

## Notes on selection:

All submissions will be evaluated using the following criteria:

- Relevance to the conference theme
- Clarity and coherence of submission
- Relevance and utility to participants

### Presenter information

- Presenters will be asked to submit an electronic version of their presentation prior to the conference
- Presenters are responsible for providing written material to conference participants
- Presenters will be provided with a designated session time to present by the conference organisers
